Malawi's Extension Landscape

A pluralistic system that includes government, private sector, NGO, other actors.





Challenges & Constraints

- DAES is under-resourced.
- DAES is under-staffed.
- Multiple responsibilities and ad hoc requests.
- Strain on DAES resources from other actors.
- Limited extension training opportunities.
